

My Brothers, My Sisters,

Today is the Second Sunday in the penitential season of Lent. If all voluntarily imposed Lenten penances are being experienced with the limitations they impose, and despite that experience of limitations you are not “caving in”, then your Lent is a holy experience. Recall any of the scenes of *The Passion of the Christ*, and you will find sufficient motivation to be faithful.

The showing of the video, *The Passion of the Christ*, had the combined total of approximately 125 adults. I am grateful to Robert and his men and to Maria Howes for taking care of all the details. While it received no recognition from the movie industry, those who have seen it know deep within themselves that, with gratitude to Mel Gibson, we have a masterpiece in this film, making reflection on the Passion easier. Truly we can better understand the theme of St. Paul: “I preach Christ crucified!” Clearly, we are grateful to that religious community that we know as the Passionists. What in reality Mel Gibson did was to give meaning to the words *scourging* and *spitting*, resistance to truth, and crowning with thorns. Most clearly we realize, the suffering of Mary, witnessing the maltreatment of her only son, not as any mother would do, but what a mother, faithful to her “Yes” of the Annunciation could only do. Perhaps, that is why the fourth and thirteenth, together with the twelfth, are the most heart rending Stations of the Cross.

I make another point, perhaps best expressed by way of questions, “Are we as a nation with all of our industrial might, advanced technologies, and immense power becoming (ever so slowly but ever so certainly) a morally bankrupt country? Are we as a country disappointing our descendants with our national silence on the travesty of sexual morality that we seemingly foist upon our youth? Is this the preparation we want our youth to absorb as they consider marriage, family, and the sexual appetite within each of us? Are these questions to be answered by the structure of government or by us, the grateful citizens who have some input into the education of our children?”

I ask you to read the press and see what is called the latest styles of dress (a billion dollar industry!) and honestly ask yourself, “Is this seductive dress? Is this the dress I would advise my child to wear? Is this the dress that best upholds the teaching of my faith about the sanctity, the sacredness, the holiness of the sexual intimacy? Is this the dress that becomes the basis of a relationship between any of my children and their present and maturing relationships with others? Is the way my children dress to become the attracting cause for their coming together?” Responsible parents, you are encouraged to ask these questions. “Is sex only physical attraction and pleasure, or does it have a divine purpose in the order of the world that the Sovereign God has imposed upon the world He has created? Can we ignore Genesis 3:11 that asks the question “Who told you that you were naked?” Are perhaps these questions the curiosity of a celibate priest, or are they real questions for my child? Your answer to that last question is perhaps the most important of all. If your answer is “Yes”, then forget the rest of this column. If your answer is “No”, then perhaps you want to pursue: what education is your child receiving in health class. By way of communication, what is your child’s understanding of a dress code that is growing more lax? Has the Sovereign God spoken about these issues through His teaching Church?

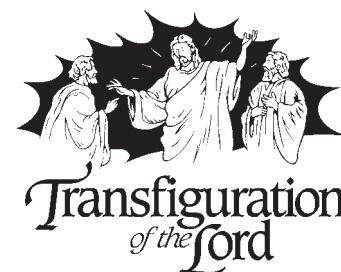
Your answers are very important. Perhaps you must become more vocal in the education of your children, in the communication with your children about these matters. Thus the often heard statement, “I am the *first* teacher of my child,” takes more meaning. A parent’s attitude and example are forceful factors in the child’s developing attitude.

Finally, as an aside for those who do not understand the right to life of the unborn, *The New York Post* of February 14 had an interesting article on page 18. After three attempts at abortion during the 24th week of gestation, the child survived, was born, and is now two years old.

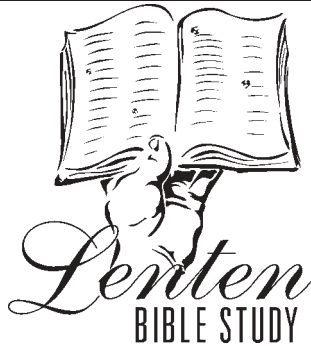

LENTEN SERIES: THE GOSPEL OF ST. MATTHEW

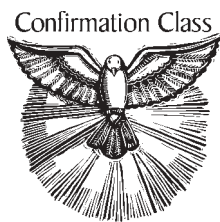

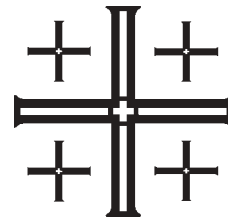

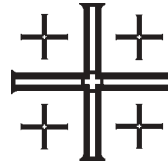
CHILDREN'S CHOIR
