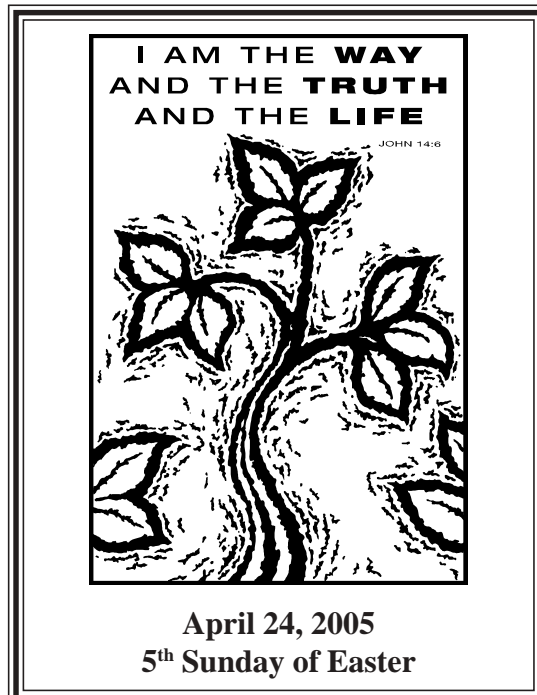

My Brothers, My Sisters,

The celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for our teens who have been preparing themselves to be fully initiated into the Church with their reception of this Sacrament last weekend was truly celebratory. We posted the names of our recipients on the cover of last week's bulletin. Bishop Brucato was effective in giving them a sense of what was happening. It was a major effort on the part of many people: catechists, lectors, sacristan, members of the music ministry, altar servers, ushers, parents, grandparents and the candidates themselves. It was the combined efforts of all that made it such a happy day for the parish. I must single out the clergy whose participation in the program gave a clear message to all that this Sacrament is precisely that – a **Sacrament** given to His Church by its founder, Jesus Christ. As such, it is a mini Pentecost. Our candidates received the Holy Spirit and His gifts of Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel, Fortitude, Knowledge, Piety and Fear of the Lord. These candidates, so gifted, assumed their responsibility for the life of the Church. It was a decisive break from what *was* to what *is now*. They were given the Sacrament to strengthen them to connect to their new responsibility, a responsibility which is held by *all* who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation. They, so gifted, are to reflect these gifts by the value-centered devotion of their lives. They are called to reflect in their personal lives, the values of Jesus Christ by their lifestyle, their choices, and by their commitment. Anything short of Jesus' teaching is to compromise Jesus Christ. That is a heavy duty. Hence, I am grateful to the clergy, for their participation, for their involvement in the programs, for their service to the parish by their example, for their celebration of Holy Mass and the Sacraments, and by their preaching. We are called; we are bound; let us respond!

Again I remind you of Cardinal Egan's appeal to every parish. If everyone in the parish makes a gift, even a small one, the total effect will ensure the success of the annual appeal for the Archdiocese to continue the charitable, educational, and pastoral services of the Archdiocese. Please consider your participation if you have not done so already.

I cannot help but notice the number of people who arrive after Mass begins or leave early, before the final hymn. This is out of order. The third commandment obliges us to be present for the entire Mass. A Mass time should be selected that allows us to come on time and to depart after the final hymn. This is presenting good example to the Church, a demand of our Baptismal promises and living our life according to our Catholic Christian vocation. Dear parishioners, please be attentive.

On Sunday, May 29<sup>th</sup>, we will have our solemn, prayerful celebration of Corpus Christi. It begins with benediction at Immaculate Conception and continues by way of procession to the play yard on the corner of Marbledale Road and Main Street for a second benediction. It ends with a third benediction at Assumption, with hospitality at Father Fata Hall, concluding our celebration. We will have a bus at Assumption taking Assumption parishioners to Immaculate Conception for the start of the procession. Following hospitality, the bus will bring Immaculate Conception parishioners back to their parish. This is a real way to show our admiration for Pope John Paul II who has dedicated the present year to demonstrate our faith in the Eucharist. We speak of it this early so that all can arrange the schedules. We are hoping to have our First Communion children with their parents to be part of this procession together with those who have received Sacraments at the Easter Vigil. During the procession, we will sing, pray the Rosary, enjoy the instrumentalists who will lead us. We hope that this Corpus Christi Procession will be outstanding in telling our community what we believe and why we process. Please plan to be with us. Please see page 10 for some pictures from last year's procession.

Yes, there will be a week-long parish mission in June given by the Franciscan Friars of the Renewal. It will be followed by a solemn celebration of a Forty Hours Devotion to our Lord, Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist. John Paul II asked that we use 2005 to proclaim our faith and to make *reparation* for those who perhaps have taken the gift for granted. As loyal parishioners, be present with your parish in these important days.

Finally, next week's column will be written by Wayne Cimon, who wants to share his journey of faith with the parish. As you know, Wayne was baptized, confirmed, and received his First Eucharist at the Easter Vigil.

Much love and many prayers for compassionate, loving, and forgiving family life.

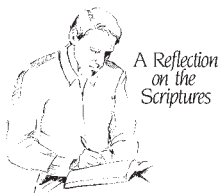

Dear Fellow Parishioner:

This year five members of our Parish will be elected to the Parish Council on the weekend of June 11-12, 2005. Four people will fill 3-year terms and the fifth person will complete the last year of a 1-year term. So that you may know more about our Parish Council, I wish to advise you as follows:

Our Parish Council consists of twelve elected members (typically four members are elected each year to serve a three year term) and other designated members of our Parish which include the Pastor, Associate Pastor(s), School Principal, Director of Religious Education, Director of the Catechumenate, and Chairman of the Finance Committee.

The Parish Council members have established a Constitution and a set of bylaws under which it operates. The Constitution defines the purpose of the Parish Council as follows:

- A. Cooperation with and advice to the Pastor with respect to any matters relating to the temporal and spiritual well being of the Parish which he chooses to refer to us.
- B. To stimulate active participation of all parishioners and provide a vehicle whereby the witness of the Christian layperson may be made more readily available to the Church of today.
- C. To bring together the Parish Family - priests, religious and laity in a spirit of trust and cooperation to study the needs of the Parish and the local Roman Catholic Christian Community and help to resolve their problems by common deliberation and common action.

ARTICLE III of the Constitution reads as follows:

“The Parish Council shall be an advisory body whose recommendations become policy when ratified by the Pastor.”

From the above you will easily recognize the importance to the Parish of our Parish Council and for the need of interested parishioners to fill the vacancies in the June 2005 elections. The newly elected members of the Parish Council take office in September 2005.

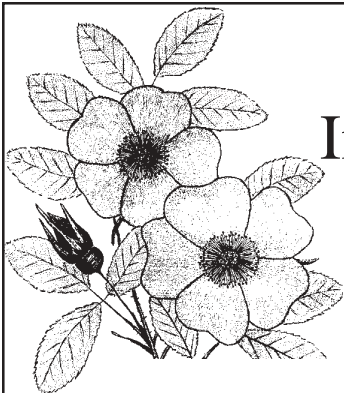
The elections this year will take place on Saturday, June 11, 2005 and Sunday, June 12, 2005. Eligible members of our Parish will vote in the Lower Church following the 5:30pm Mass on Saturday, June 11<sup>th</sup> and after all of the Masses on Sunday, June 12<sup>th</sup>. Parishioners wishing to be candidates for election may secure a place on the ballot by presenting a petition signed by fifteen (15) registered parishioners in support of their candidacy. Nominating petitions may be obtained at the Rectory Monday through Friday from 8:30am to 8:30pm. The Committee has established Sunday, May 22, 2005 at 5:00 pm as the closing date for receipt of candidacy petitions, after which time each candidate will be contacted for further information if required.

#### Topic: Life is Sacred from Conception to Natural Death

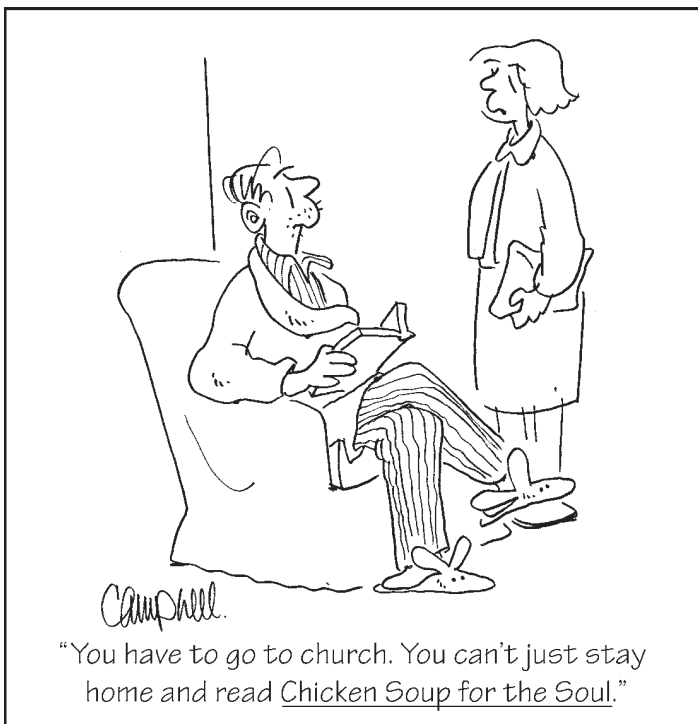
