Since 1974, the last Sunday of every January marks the start of Catholic Schools Week in the United States. This week-long event, jointly sponsored by National Catholic Educational Association (NCEA) and the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) is a time to honor the mission of Catholic education, its impact on individuals and the community, and to emphasize effective marketing of Catholic schools.

This year the theme for Catholic Schools Week is ***Catholic Schools: Faith. Academics. Service.*** The annual observance starts today and runs all week.

First some fun facts: Total Catholic school student enrollment for the 2010-2011 academic year in the United States was 2,065,872 students. Currently, there are 6,980 Catholic schools in the United States: 5,774 elementary schools; 1,206 high schools. Last year, 34 new schools opened and, sadly, 172 schools closed or consolidated. Our school is very strong.

Our parish has been blessed from the beginning to have a fine Catholic school; since 1913 the Sisters of St. Francis have been an integral part of the story of ICS. Also through the years, dedicated lay teachers have given our children not only a fine academic education, but more importantly, training in virtue and Christian living. Over the years, ICS has adapted to the changing times and academic advances in education.

In the area of technology, ICS is very advanced. There are now a total of 21 e-boards: *SMART* or *Promethean* interactive education white boards. They are in all the classes from Pre-K 3 through 8th grades, including Music, Technology, Physical Education/Health, and Art. Our students use *Apple MacBooks* in the tech lab and our 5th - 8th graders are invited to bring e-readers to school. Some of our text books are CD's. All our teachers are trained to use the *SMART* or *Promethean* boards, *ELMOs* (a wireless tablet) and *AIRLINERS* (you can use the pen to write on the surface of the wireless slate, your handwriting displays on both your computer screen and the SMART Board interactive whiteboard or a projection screen for all to see). Education has certainly changed over the years. No more getting out of class early to clap the erasers - there are no more erasers!!

There are special events slated for Catholic Schools Week at ICS. There will be an Open House for all our parishioners and guests to visit the school on **Monday, January 30** 6:00-8:00 PM and on **Wednesday, February 1** 9:00 AM-2:00 PM. Tuesday is the current families day to visit their children's classrooms and have lunch with them. **Thursday, February 2** is *Teacher Appreciation Day* and a few of our Alumni will come back for Career Visits. Then on **Friday, February 3** is a *special invitation* to attend the 9:15 AM School Mass.

At that Mass, we will be starting a new tradition in honor of the Sisters of St. Francis, who taught in our school for almost 100 years. We want the spirit of St. Francis and the Sisters to remain. At the Mass, our 8th graders will receive the ICS School Pin in the form of the "Tau Cross" which St. Francis used to teach about the Passion of the Lord. A reception for 8th Grade parents will follow. The traditional Blessing of Throats on the feast of St. Blaise will take place on that day at the conclusion of Mass.

All of us should be very proud of our school. I know there are parishioners who wish they could afford to send their children to Catholic schools, but simply can't afford both the tuition and the local taxes; yet there are families who are sacrificing much to send their children to ICS. I only wish that all could attend a Catholic School if they so choose. In the meantime, we can all be proud of Catholic education in general and ICS in particular.

Lord Jesus, Son of God, Thank you for the gift of Catholic education. Day after day, week after week, you give us many opportunities to grow and learn. Help us respond to the gift of faith so that we may be recognized as your disciples. Amen.

We often receive requests for tax substantiation letters. These letters summarize donations for the tax year. Some people use these letters to prepare their tax returns. Many include the letter with the tax return when it is mailed to the IRS. Some will only request the letter in the event of an audit.

If you are a registered parishioner, we can provide you with a tax substantiation letter if you are using the envelope system. If you have an e-mail address, please include it on the front of your next envelope - within a day or two, we will e-mail your tax letter, which can be readily forwarded to your tax accountant. If you do not have an e-mail address, please wait until the end of January to call the rectory and ask for a letter.
